John 3:16

16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

1 John 4:16-21

- 16 And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.
- 17 Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world.
- 18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.
- 19 We love him, because he first loved us.
- 20 If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?
- 21 And this commandment have we from him, That he who loveth God love his brother also.

1 Corinthians 13:2-13

- 2 And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing.
- 3 And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing.
- 4 Charity suffereth long, and is kind; charity envieth not; charity vaunteth not itself, is not puffed up,
- 5 Doth not behave itself unseemly, seeketh not her own, is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil; 6 Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth in the truth;
- 7 Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things.
- 8 Charity never faileth: but whether there be prophecies, they shall fail; whether there be tongues, they shall cease; whether there be knowledge, it shall vanish away.
- 9 For we know in part, and we prophesy in part.
- 10 But when that which is perfect is come, then that which is in part shall be done away.
- 11 When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things.
- 12 For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known.

13 And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

Peace

Romans 14:17-19

1 Now I Paul myself beseech you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ, who in presence am base among you, but being absent am bold toward you:

Goodness

Psalms 23:6

6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

Romans 11:22

22 Behold therefore the goodness and severity of God: on them which fell, severity; but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue in his goodness: otherwise thou also shalt be cut off.

Psalms 16:2-3

- 2 O my soul, thou hast said unto the LORD, Thou art my Lord: my goodness extendeth not to thee;
- 3 But to the saints that are in the earth, and to the excellent, in whom is all my delight.

Faith

Romans 1:16-17

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

17 For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, The just shall live by faith.

Matthew 8:10

10 When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel.

Romans 3:22

22 Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference:

1 Timothy 2:25

25 In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth;

Temperance

Philemon 4:5

5 Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.

James 1:19

19 Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath:

James 3:2

2 For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same is a perfect man, and able also to bridle the whole body.

James 3:13

13 Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.

Definitions

Love

Strong's Concordance, Hebrew

Courtesy to an equal, to be kind, to show itself merciful, good deed, kindly, loving, kindness, pity.

Strong's Concordance, Greek

To love in a social or moral sense, beloved, to be a friend to, fond of an individual or an object, have affection for denoting personal attachment, as a matter of principal duty and propriety; the intellect, divine or human, in thought, feeling or will.

Joy

Strong's Concordance, Hebrew

To brighten up, to make blithe or gleesome, cheer up, make glad, cause to rejoice and make merry hearted, exceeding gladness, mirth, pleasure, and rejoicing.

Strong's Concordance, Greek

Cheerfulness or calm delight, gladness, exceedingly joyful, well off, especially, as a salutation on meeting, be well, be glad, God speed, greeting, rejoice, hail.

Peace

Strong's Concordance, Hebrew

Silent and to let alone, think, cease, conceal, leave off speaking, hold peace, be quiet, rest, practice secretly, speak not a word, be still, hold tongue, silence, cunning.

Strong's Concordance, Greek

To join; prosperity: quietness, rest, peaceable, to be a peacemaker, to harmonize, to show or make known one's thoughts, to lighten or shine, appear to be or seem to shine and think.

Longsuffering

Strong's Concordance, Greek

To be long spirited, forbearing or patient, bear, suffer long, have long patience, be patient, patiently endure, fortitude, forbearance, with long enduring temper, leniently.

Gentleness

Strong's Concordance, Hebrew

To give heed, pay attention, to begin to speak, to cry, to lift up, clemency, humility and meekness, saintly, humble, lowly, meek.

Strong's Concordance, Greek

Excellence, gentleness, goodness, kindness, useful, better, gracious, kind to handle, to furnish what is needed, to act toward one in a given manner, or entreat, to lend or loan.

Goodness

Strong's Concordance, Greek

Good in any sense, benefit good things well, virtue or beneficence, useful in manner or morals, gracious and kind.

Faith

Strong's Concordance, Greek

Persuasion, conviction of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God, reliance upon Christ for salvation; constancy in such profession such as gospel truth itself; assurance, belief, faith, fidelity, inward certainty, obey, persuade, trust, yield, the evidence of authority.

Meekness

Strong's Concordance, Hebrew

Mildness, royal, modesty, clemency.

Humble, meek, gentleness, humility.

Temperance

Self-control, to exercise self restraint in diet and chastity, masterful.
